

Week beginning 13th January 2019

This week's English focus has continued to be on The Great Fire of London. The children learned how reporters at the scene of an event report and record what they have seen. They even tried a spot of interviewing with their friends, making their reports as exciting as possible. They used adjectives and descriptive phrases to prepare for their writing and finally began to write their reports out for our display.



In phonics we have been learning about the sounds that the letter 'y' can make and the words that it appears in e.g. y in python, y in gymnast, y in happy.

In maths we were looking at place value and what the numerals in a two digit number actually represent e.g. 27 represents 2 groups of ten and has a value 20 and 27 represents 7 ones and has a value of 7.

The children had lots of fun creating an 'action painting' in the style of Jackson Pollack, using primary colours. We even managed to do some painting outside in the sunshine. This was a great way of creating a flaming backdrop for our Fire of London Display. Thank you to everyone who donated bottles to the cause, they were really useful!
