
Week beginning 4th March 2019

In maths this week we wrote a number story about an addition or subtraction number sentence e.g.

For 12-8 = 4 We could make up the story: If there are 12 cakes at a party and 8 of them are eaten, how many would be left?

In English we looked at the next 'Hampshire Picture Book Awards' book, 'There was an Old Giant who swallowed a clock'.



This was another enjoyable book and the last of the four being voted for this year. The children have been scoring the books on a chart to work out which one should be this year's winner. You could ask your child which one was their favourite and why.

All of the year group have now visited Stubbington Library, where the librarians explained how many great activities and facilities they have to offer and read stories to the children. Did you know that children can borrow up to 30 books at a time! They also reminded children about the 'Summer Reading Challenge' and how they could take part.

In Geography we looked at the local area and maps. The children produced their own map of the school and its' grounds.

In P.E. we are continuing with Hockey and have just started our 'Spring' dance, hoping to tempt the good weather!

Art activities have begun in school this week, with the children studying a professional artist and beginning to produce art 'in the style of'. The first to inspire us is Este Mcloed. Year 1 will be visiting Southampton Gallery on Tuesday, with the opportunity to look at rare drawings in an exhibition by Leonardo Di Vinci.
