Maths


This week we began the week reading multiplication sentences and representing them as an array, using practical equipment. We then moved on to fractions, learning what a 'whole', 'half' and 'quarter' look like and how it is written. We cut fruit and paper shapes into halves and quarters.

English

Science

We thought about how we could make the test fair, for example, ensure that there weren't big gaps and place the ice cubes in the same place. We then observed the ice cube at various intervals and recorded our findings. It was very exciting!
