Challenge: can you think of another way to make this sound? Read a fiction book for 10 minutes with an adult. Reading Take it in turns to read a line each. Focus on adding expression to your voice. Have a go at writing an acrostic poem about one of the minibeasts you found or Writing researched yesterday. Remember to write the name of the insect down the side of 15 minutes your page in capitals. Here's an example: Spider Spider People are scared of spiders. It has eight legs. Different spiders are venomous. Each spider builds different webs. Red-back spiders are venomous. The letter family is: Special squirter (e) **Handwriting** 10 minutes Down-bump Push a line (along the ground). -pen off-Push across Push a top line across. -pen off-Pull around Push a middle line across. And Push Practice the capital and lower case letter in your book. Make sure you draw a tree at the start of each line to help you. Mental maths: Counting **Maths** Pull around and forwards/backwards in 5's. Can you 15 minutes make it all the way to 50? Pull back (along the ground), Push up, Number of the day: 8 (practice Pull back and join writing using a line in your book) Have a go at creating your own addition number sentences using the numbers on the pebbles e.g. 8 + 2. If you have a dice at home, you could use this to generate your own number sentence!
