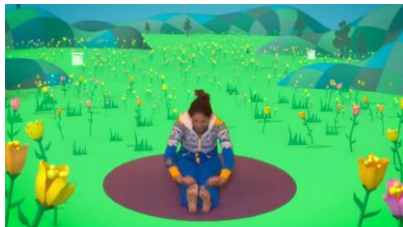

This week's wider curriculum learning is linked to the book 'The Extraordinary Gardener'.

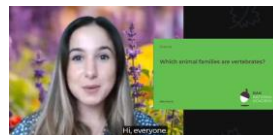
Key learning area:
