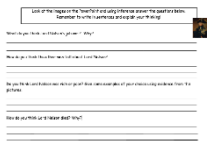


Monday

Today we are going to organise some facts about Lord Nelson. When we put things into the correct order that they happened, it is known as chronological order. We have used chronology in Year 1 on our class timeline, and when we learned about Mary Anning, so the concept is not new. There are 2 worksheets for today. Firstly, can you put the images of Lord Nelson in the correct chronological order from youngest to oldest? The second sheet contains facts that have been jumbled up and it is your job to put them into chronological order.
