## **Promoting British Values at Crofton Hammond Infant School**

The Government set out its definition of British Values in the 2011 Prevent Strategy, and these values were reiterated in 2014. At Crofton Hammond Infant School these values are reinforced regularly and in the following ways:

- Across the school we actively promote these values through the work of our curriculum, our whole school assemblies, our class assemblies, the teaching of PSHE, SMSC, Philosophy for Children and the RE curriculum.
- We encourage the children to become involved in decision making and
  we ensure that all children are listened to particularly by being on the
  school council or being a young ambassador. We also involve children in
  choice about the curriculum itself, and match the work to their interests
- We help our children to express their views by developing speaking and listening, debate and discussion through our broad and balance curriculum, i.e. circle time and P4C
- We show our children how perceived injustices can be peacefully challenged through our behaviour policy and our work around what makes a good 'Crofton Learner'

- We help children develop an age appropriate understanding of living under the rule of law and how that protects individuals in our society.
   Each class develops their own class rules which children have to agree to by signing their name.
- As an inclusive school we actively support our pupils to develop their self-knowledge, self-esteem and self-confidence, through our belief in diversity and every child having 'the chance to shine'
- We discuss differences between people and encourage pupils to develop their own thinking skills
- We promote and implement a strong anti-bullying culture with zero tolerance of unkindness towards others
- We help our pupils develop an awareness of their own and other cultures and ways of life by celebrating different cultures, beliefs and festival through a well-balance collective worship programme and class curriculum
- We endeavour to prepare our pupils for life as active citizens by encouraging them to engage in support of charities both locally, nationally and world wide
