 We intend to inspire and develop children's interest in art and design. We aim to provide rich arts experiences for all pupils, allowing them to participate in a range of creative activities and events within and outside of the curriculum. We want to foster children's natural creativity, valuing the experimental processes just as much as the outcome. We aim for children to develop and extend a curiosity in the visual world through careful observations. We will provide a stimulating and exciting environment in which children are able to explore and express their own ideas and feelings, using a wide range of media and forms. We want to deliver a curriculum that develops a progression of skills and techniques within the EYFS and throughout KS1. We want to develop children's understanding of the different elements of art and encourage them to develop and use art specific vocabulary. 	 In line with our whole school approach, we teach art and design through cross-curricular, child-initiated topics. We also give children the freedom to explore their own unique outcomes. In the EYFS there are many opportunities for expressive art and design within the planned continuous provision. We encourage children to use drawing as a tool throughout all areas of the curriculum. We closely track art and design skills coverage, to ensure progression throughout KS1. Children learn the skills of drawing, painting, printing, collage, textiles, and 3D work. Children in KS1 keep a sketchbook, which they use for exploring, recording and reflecting on their ideas. Children are introduced to a range of 2D and 3D materials, and given opportunity to explore the capacities in which they can be used. We teach and model the techniques needed for children to create and develop their own artwork. 	 Children will have an appreciation and enjoyment of art and design. Children will be given a wide range of opportunities to express themselves creatively in open-ended contexts. Children will make their own choices when selecting tools and materials for art and design activities. Children will review and modify work as it progresses- reflecting upon achievement, suggesting ways of improving work and expressing opinions about others work. Children will investigate, appreciate and evaluate the work of a range of artists, craftspeople and designers in different times and from their own and other cultures. Children will develop their technical art and design skills and demonstrate progression as they gain experience across KS1.
